New Visions is a one-year, honors-level, four-credit program that turns area businesses into classrooms for highly motivated, academically successful high school seniors. Students spend up to 3 1/2 hours per day on-site and learn about a profession firsthand through job shadowing rotations, internships and in-depth study. They earn four high school honors credits and may earn AP and college credit as well.

- Health Careers
- Journalism & Media Studies
- Law & Government

Why apply to New Visions?

New Visions immerses you in a career field while building your academic skills and your transcript. Colleges and universities like New Visions because it prepares students for higher level study and the rigors of college life. New Visions classes are small, and you'll experience and explore with students who share your interests and talents. You'll take part in exciting internships and job shadow professionals in the field. You'll work hard, but you'll also have a lot of fun.

Where do I go to class?

Students work with their high school to arrange transportation to New Visions classroom locations. New Visions meets during the first part of the day, from 8 -11:30 a.m. Our locations are:

- New Visions: Health Careers meets at either Ellis Hospital, Schenectady, or St. Peter's Hospital, Albany
- New Visions: Journalism & Media Studies meets at the *Times Union* newspaper offices in Colonie
- New Visions: Law & Government meets across from the state Capitol, in the State Education Bldg., in Albany

Who's eligible to apply?

Students who are interested in New Visions must complete an application and interview process. They must have a GPA of 85 or above, a positive attendance pattern, maturity and ability to work both independently and in teams, as well as strong communication skills i.e., reading, writing, speaking, listening.
